Highlight - Literacy & Numeracy Instruction:

Guthrie School will continue to focus on the improvement of numeracy and literacy instruction. Improving numerical fluency for both staff and students. Learning coaches will support teachers in implementing the new ELA and Math curriculums. Administration will work with all staff to leverage multiple sources of data to improve literacy and numeracy outcomes across the school. Teachers will be encouraged to invite CAF members into their classrooms to explore real world applications of key numerical and literacy concepts and skills.


Priority: Student Success and Division Wellness


